Guidelines for authors and readers

Focus and Scope

South African Family Practice (SAFP) is a peer-reviewed scientific journal, which strives to provide primary care physicians and researchers with a broad range of scholarly work in the disciplines of Family Medicine, Primary Health Care, Rural Medicine, District Health and other related fields. The Journal publishes original research, clinical reviews, and pertinent commentary that advance the knowledge base of these disciplines. The content of *SAFP* is designed to reflect and support further development of the broad basis of these disciplines through original research and critical review of evidence in important clinical areas; as well as to provide practitioners with continuing professional development material.

All manuscripts will be subject to blinded peer-review and the decision of the Editor will be final. Articles submitted for consideration by the Editor should not have been published before, either in total or in part, nor be currently submitted to any other publisher. The Editor retains the right to stylise and shorten any material accepted for publication. Accepted manuscripts will be copy edited and galley proofs will be sent to the author for approval. Preference is given to articles presenting the results of original research or evidence-based clinical reviews, relevant to family medicine, primary health care, district health or rural medicine. Opinions expressed in the Journal should not be taken to represent the policies of the *South African Academy of Family Practice/Primary Care*, or the Publisher (Medpharm Publications (Pty) Ltd). Submissions in any official language of South Africa will be considered for publication within the framework of the *SAFP* mission to appeal to the widest possible readership. Please note that all articles in the Original Research section will follow a “print-short, web-long” policy, which means that only the abstracts will be published in print, with the full article published on the web. Some review articles may also be published under these provisions.

SAFP is ABC audited and is distributed to 5 000 general and family practitioners and is published bi-monthly (6 times per year).

First time authors must register with the website (tick “author” box). A registered author must login and click on “Manuscript submissions” below the masthead or click on “User Home” and select his/her role as author. Click on “CLICK HERE to go to step one of the five-step submission process”. An acknowledgement e-mail will be sent upon successful submission.

All submissions must adhere to the international editorial standards as published by *The International Committee of Medical Journal Editors (ICMJE)* (http://www.icmje.org/urm_main.html) which supports the Vancouver referencing method. Manuscripts must be uploaded as MS Word documents and images must be uploaded as high resolution jpeg or tiff files.
