Basil Jaffe

Basil Jaffe qualified at the University of Cape Town in 1946. Apart from two years internship and three years post-graduate training in Britain he has been in active general practice since then.

He has been actively involved in the academic organizations of general practice for the past twenty years.

He was elected chairman of the Faculty of General Practice of the College of Medicine in 1973-74 and 1977-80.

He lectures at U.C.T. in the Departments of Community Health, Paediatrics and Psychiatry.

He is co-author of "Guide to the Content and Attitudes of General Practice" and contributor to "The Scientific Basis of Breast Feed-

ing".

He holds the D.C.H. (R.C.P. & S.) and in 1975 was elected a Fellow of the Royal College of General Practitioners.

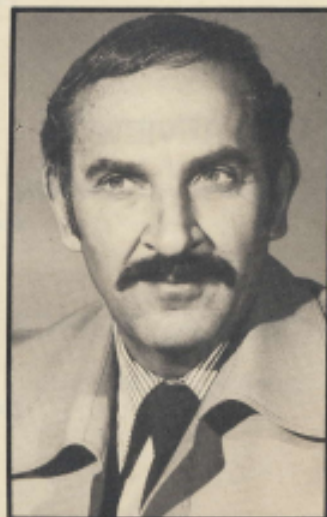

Beste George,

Van harte geluk met 'n puik blad. In die verlede is dikwels op 'n afskeep manier gepoog om in die akademiese behoeftes van die stiefbroer van geneeskunde te voorsien. Huisartspraktyk Suid-Afrika vul beslis 'n groot leemte.

Die artikels wat in die eerste uitgawe verskyn het, is van hoogstaande gehalte. Ek was veral beïndruk met die hoe akademiese peil en gepaardgaande nugter en praktiese benadering van die skrywers.

Daar is min huisartse wat nie beseft dat die hantering van 'n asma aanval op 'n plaas of 'n koroner op die tennisbaan, nie gaan afhang van 'n astrup of die serum K₂ nie, maar wel van akademiese onderlegtheid en beproefde regimes. Ek wil derhalwe 'n beroep doen om artikels van praktiese aard. Wie is byvoorbeeld aan sy alma mater onderrig in die kuns om 'n wond korrek te heg? Nuwere tegnieke en materiale kan gerus toegelig word. Navorsingsresultate het dikwels praktiese implikasies en toepassing in huisartspraktyk. Dit behoort nie beperk te word tot die lesers 'n subspesialiteits tydskrif nie!

Oorsig artikels is egter nog van wesentlike belang. Konsolidasie van ons bestaande en soms vervaagde kennis, bly nog 'n hoeksteen van ons akademiese fondament.

Die huisarts kan net oorleef as hy voldoende akademiese kennis en praktiese vernuf het om die respek van sy pasiente af te dwing.

Graag wil ek u gelukwens met die puik tydskrif Family Practice/Huisartspraktyk SA. Ek het die eerste uitgawe baie interessant en stimulerend gevind, veral die artikel "Problems in Primary Care", en hoop om die toekoms nog meer sulke artikels te sien.

Die afgelope twee jaar het ek meer aandag gegee aan sykamerondersoeke wat in die algemene praktyk uitgevoer kan word, ten einde 'n beter diens aan ons pasiente te kan lewer.

Enige toets wat uitgevoer word, word natuurlik in die eerste plek gedoen in belang van die pasient, maar dit gee die praktisyn 'n groot mate van genoegdoening en dit maak die sleur van elke dag se medisyne soveel interessanter.

Nou wonder ek of u in hierdie nuwe tydskrif nie dalk 'n ruimte kan afstaan aan 'n reeks waarin u vir ons op 'n kort, bondige, geïllustreerde wyse hierdie algemene sykamerondersoeke kan leer wat binne die bestek van enige algemene praktisyn se vermoë is nie?

Ek het gevind dat dit nie altyd die gebrek aan tyd is wat my weerhou het daarvan om 'n toets uit te voer nie, maar wel omdat ek nie presies geweet het hoe die toets uitgevoer moet word nie, en dan het ek die moeite ontsien om 'n teksboek te gaan naslaan, want dit neem tyd.
